

COVID-19 Camping Guidelines
for Concessionaire implementation
as of March 1, 2021

- All visitors must wear a mask when physical distancing of 6 feet apart cannot reasonably be maintained.
- If anyone in a party is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, they should not attempt to stay at the campground.
- Campsites can only accommodate the single group of registered guests to that campsite.
- Limited shower and restrooms are available.
- Campfires are limited to the single group occupying that campsite.
- Campers are encouraged to use any self-contained restroom in their own camper for restroom or shower.
- All Campers are encouraged to visit www.cdc.gov/family/camping for updated best camping practices.
- Tent camping is allowed at this time, provided restrooms are cleaned and sanitized per current CDC guidelines. Note: Subject to change if COVID-19 guidelines become more stringent due to a resurgence of positive cases in the southern region of Illinois.
- Beaches may open, while beach-goers practice social distancing, and the number of people at the beach is 50 or less. Note: Subject to change if COVID-19 guidelines become more stringent due to a resurgence of positive cases in the southern region of Illinois.
- Current COVID-19 signage with guidelines from the CDC and State of Illinois regarding social distancing, sanitizing, and also campground-specific rules must be posted prevalently throughout the facility.
